

English

- To create independent pieces of writing in a range of genres.
- To select the appropriate genre of writing for the task at hand.
- To use skills of inference and deduction to gain understanding of challenging reading texts.
- To write thoughtfully in response to reading a variety of shorter texts.
- To produce pieces of writing that are suitable for the audience and purpose of the task.
- To produce balanced discussion, argument and non-chronological report pieces.

Maths

- To apply knowledge of a wide range of mathematical concepts in the following areas: Number; 4 Operations; Statistics; Shape, Space and Scale; Algebra and Ratio and Proportion.
- To use enquiry as a tool for learning in mathematics with pupils demonstrating their understanding independently and creatively.
- To have time to independently study areas of maths which are of interest or require further consolidation.

Science

- To learn about the properties of materials and investigate those that are best suited to specific purposes.
- To investigate which materials are best suited to prepare, package and insulate food.
- To plan a fair test and draw findings from investigations.

Junior Sports Leadership Award

- Team teach a programme of at least 6 outdoor P.E sessions to a small group of Yr1/2 children.
- Create plans for each session including warm ups, main activities and feedback sessions.
- Maintain a thorough portfolio of written, anecdotal and photographic evidence to support the final assessment.
- Produce an independent piece of writing to explain how the course has impacted upon them.

Awareness Week

- To gain a greater awareness about travel safety including the roads and railways.

General Information for Parents

Homework

Homework tasks will be set to underpin the learning that has taken place that week or which is due to take place the following week. It is important that children complete the homework as it will provide them the opportunity to either consolidate their learning or have prior understanding before learning a new concept in maths and literacy. Children will also be expected to be able to discuss their homework with adults and other pupils during lesson time. The following tasks should be completed on a weekly basis:

- Maths and Literacy tasks (max 30 minutes each)
- Spellings and times tables practice
- Short art based homework projects to accompany our art topic.

Planners

Children are expected to take their planner home and bring them back to school every day. We will collect in planners on a Monday. These need to be signed weekly by parents/carers to encourage the children to be organised and to ensure there is regular communication between home and school.

Homework Club

For children who struggle to find the time at home to complete homework, or for those that require adult support for a particular task, there will be a voluntary homework club every Wednesday lunchtime. The club is open to all Year 5/6 pupils and children can choose to attend whenever they wish. During this time, the children can be supported by a teacher and complete some of their homework within school.

If pupils have not handed their homework in on time, there will be a compulsory Monday lunchtime catch-up club to ensure that children are able to attend lessons fully prepared.

Reading

Please continue to hear your child read as regularly as possible. We expect children to read at least 3 times weekly, either independently or to an adult. At least one of these occasions should be to an adult at home.

PE

Please ensure that PE kits are brought in at the beginning of the week and taken home to be washed at the end of the week. PE sessions will take place on Tuesday, Thursday or Friday afternoons. **The following kit is required for indoor sessions: a t- shirt, shorts and trainers only. For outdoor sessions during the summer the following kit is required: a t-shirt, shorts and trainers (not plimsolls). Suncream and a hat are optional but recommended during the summer.**

For safety reasons, children with long hair will be required to tie it back and those children with earrings will be required to remove them, or cover them, with micropore tape before taking part. Unless a child has a note from home excusing them from P.E for an injury they will be expected to take part in the session.
