



Report on the use of PE and Sports Funding

Barnham Primary School

Overview

The government believes that funding for PE, which is additional to main school funding, is the best way to address the current underlying issues relating to pupil access to an appropriate PE curriculum and extra-curricular sporting activities. The PE Funding was introduced in September 2013 and is allocated to schools to implement as they see fit. The conditions require primary schools to use the premium for additional and sustainable improvements to their PE and sport provision and to encourage healthy, active lifestyles.

Principles

- We ensure that teaching and learning opportunities for PE meet the needs of all of the pupils.
- We ensure that all appropriate provision is made for all pupils to take part in PE lessons.
- We ensure that the school takes part in competitive sporting activities within the school and with other schools.
- We ensure that a range of extra-curricular sporting activities are provided by the school and outside agencies.

Provision

The range of provision the school may consider include:

- Providing access for staff to attend training in order to develop skills and knowledge. Providing access to specialist teaching staff/ coaches to work alongside members of staff in order to develop skills and knowledge. Funding attendance for sporting events and activities
- Acquiring effective materials, resources and equipment in order to increase the quality of learning experience for the children.
- Acquiring effective materials, resources and equipment in order to increase the quality of inclusion and access for all pupils.
- Information of the allocation and funding will be published annually by the school.

PE Funding Allocation for 2014-15: £9069

Nature of support 2014-15

Through the implementation and coordination of a locality wide sporting partnership as devised by Barnham Primary School – 250 children in KS 2 attended sporting competitions and events eg football, rugby, athletics, netball

- Purchase and installation of new Football posts in order to host increased training opportunities for pupils eg Year 3/ 4 and 5/6 football; as well as host competitive matches for the school and for the local football team, Barnham Trojans (£1000)
- Coordination and implementation of Active8 programme for developing pupil engagement and focus in learning through access to sporting activities before the school day begins. 10 children took part for 3 sessions a week from 7.45 till 8.45, breakfast was included (£2500)
- Attendance of increased number of sporting events through funds for access to events eg netball (matches), or increased coaching opportunities eg cricket & rugby. (£3000)
- Membership of English Schools Athletic Association Award Scheme to support provision of Athletics (£200)
- Purchase of sports equipment and games including rugby, tennis and indoor equipment to increase the range of sports on offer and encourage participation. (£2500)

PE Funding Allocation for 2015-16: £9285

- Whole School Multi Sports taster session (£1500). 300 children introduced to new sports and activities.
- Visit by Maggie Alphonsi (International Rugby Player) (£650)





- Purchase of sports uniform and clothing for events and competitions (£1000)
- Purchase of sports equipment and resources for whole school competitions (£500)
- Purchase of equipment and resources for playtime activities and before and after school clubs. Number of sporting clubs available has increased to 12. (£500)
- Attendance of a number of sporting events and competitions, including dance and netball. (£500)
- Sussex Cricket Coaching for Year 5/6 and continuation of cricket club, with a 20% increase in the number of children attending from last year together with entering a third more competitions.(£500)
- Implementation and management of a Multi-Sports Holiday Club for children in the local area (£750)
- Supply teacher costs to cover staff attending events (£1600)
- £1758 to be allocated with funding for 2016-2017 and used for the development of a Sports Leader.

PE Funding Allocation for 2016-17: £9500 + £1758 (allocated from 2015-2016)

- Membership of the West Sussex West Schools Partnership (£1650). This opened up a wealth of sporting events that we could be involved in together with CPD for staff in areas such as gymnastics, dance and rugby. This cost also covered the running of our sports day in June. Events – football, athletics, cricket, swimming, multi skills, KS1 P.E festival, netball comps
Currently 70 children across KS1 and 2 have attended sports events outside of school with a further 120 booked to attend future events this year. In previous years this may have been 30 to 40 children across the school. This is a 5-fold increase on previous years. We have created approx. 170 more opportunities for children to take part in competitive sport. Generated interest in sports that children hadn't accessed before such as netball and increased male participation in this sport. We have also entered teams into sports we don't have a club or school team for. 190 children took part in these sporting events. This is a five-fold increase over previous years.
- Supply teacher costs to cover staff attending events (£2740)
- Entry into sporting events provided by agencies outside of the Sports Partnership (£900)
- Minibus hire and other travel expenses to sporting events (£1200)
- Purchase of new sports equipment to replace ageing and broken resources (£855)
- Sussex Cricket Coaching for Year 3/4 and continuation of cricket club, with a 20% increase in the number of children attending from last year together with entering a third more competitions.(£500)
- Implementation and management of a Multi-Sports Holiday Club for children in the local area (£750)
- £2663 to be allocated with funding for 2017-2018 and used for the development of a Sports Leader at Playtimes
