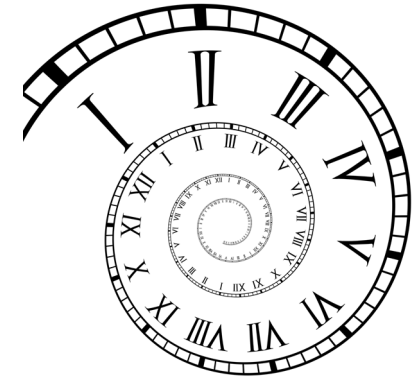

Knowledge Organiser:

Vocabulary	Definition
era	A span of time usually defined by the ruling monarch
chronological	In the order of time.
monarch	A sovereign head of state (king/queen/emperor)
century	A period of 100 years
decade	A period of 10 years
AD	'Anno Domini' (in the year of the Lord) the years following the birth of Christ (Year 0)
BC	'before Christ' years prior to the birth of Christ (Year 0)
artefact	An object made by human being of historical interest
primary source	Original documents/evidence from the time being studied. Created by someone present at the time.
secondary source	Document/evidence created later than the time being studied by someone who did not experience event first-hand.
prehistoric	Relating to a period of time before written records

Key facts and dates

- ◆ Discovered in 1993 in Boxgrove, West Sussex
- ◆ Two pieces of the Tibia (shin bone) and two teeth were found.
- ◆ Believed to be the oldest human remains found in the UK
- ◆ Found alongside bones of exotic animals including Rhinos and Hyenas.

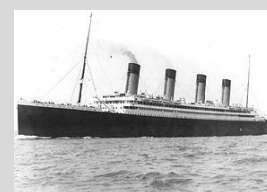
Pudding Lane

Key facts and dates

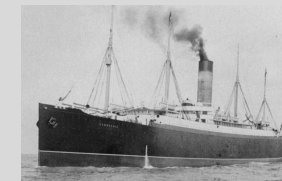
- ♦ Fire burned from Sunday 2nd to Thursday 6th September 1666
- ♦ Started in the bakery owned by Thomas Farriner in Pudding Lane
- ♦ Account of the fire written by Samuel Pepys in his diary.

- ♦ Launched - 31st May 1911
- ♦ Maiden Voyage - 10th April 1912
- ♦ Sank - 15th April 1912
- ♦ Estimated 2224 passengers and crew on board
